Through our connect groups we are in contact with more than 150 people from our church community. It is through these groups that we able to help one another, pray and be reassured that we are not alone.

The connect group leaders are also enabling each of us to join in with the Prayer Course. This is our focus for the weeks ahead. The course is a brilliant opportunity to become more confident in prayer. The music group from the 11.00 am service have been able to sing and play 'together' by the wonders of technology and the fantastic work of those recording and collating. We look forward to many more opportunities to create ways to worship together, remain united and reach out to others.

Easter weekend saw both our youth (ages 11-16) and children (5-10) engaging in church activities. Parents are enabling them to access the groups on 'Zoom' (video conferences) on Sunday mornings. These are important times, although the activities look mostly like fun, they are providing forums for our young people to remain connected with the church family. Our children have also experienced loss and many changes over the past weeks; it is vital that they are encouraged in their faith and grow in fellowship with one another.

The PCC will continue to meet monthly via video call as will the Standing Committee. As church we are also in partnership with Copthorne Village Support Group (CVSG). CVSG provides a helpline for those who need support in addition to the provision from the Government. Please ensure you use this service and encourage others to do so especially if you hear of people who need delivery of medicine, shopping or other forms support.

Finally, I would like to encourage you with the ancient blessing from the Old Testament. When Aaron blesses God's people before they go back to their own tents with the words:
