Editorial

Recently I went to a talk by Emily Mayhew about her latest book, 'The Four Horsemen and the Hope of a New Age'. Emily Mayhew is a military historian based at Imperial College London where she studies 'severe casualty in 20th and 21st century warfare'.

The book uses the well known biblical symbolism of the four horsemen of the apocalypse to discuss the threats humanity faces; war, pestilence, famine and death. Of course, these have never left us and are always a part of global citizenship, but are even more present at the moment as we deal with the fallout of covid-19, witness the desperate situation unfolding in Ukraine, and host refugees in our own village.

The book is both horrifying and hopeful. Watching news reports of events unfolding in Ukraine is heart breaking. Re-reading the first chapter of Emily's book (War), which charts the liberation of Mosul in 2017, highlighted what we might not see behind the scenes: living next door to unexploded bombs; permanent deafness due to shelling; crops destroyed or poisoned - generations of investment in agriculture and livelihoods wiped out; children

climbing over rubble to get to school - desperate to learn in order to find a solution to the nightmare they are living through.

But also, the book brings hope. It is clear from Emily Mayhew's knowledge that there are some amazing people out there, trying to deal with the threats and 'stop the horsemen'. Amazingly brainy scientists are using AI to repurpose drugs, and are using covid-19 to increase research into anti-microbial resistance, farmers are working to protect crops from disease, humanitarian groups are using paper trails to protect the rights of the dead after war and natural disasters. There are a humbling amount of humanitarian volunteers who work so hard. We should also not ignore the massive resource of collective wisdom and knowledge, recorded by historians and people who have carried out this sort of humanitarian work before.

The message I took away from the book is that we all have to change and - which is what Emily Mayhew argues for - we all have to work together. It is not enough to leave it to a few and hope for the best. We need to think of ourselves as global citizens now, not individuals or even countries. Everything is interconnected. War brings famine, famine decimates immune systems, leaving it easier for pestilence to spread. Antibiotic use is critical, the knock on effect is global. The more people that have vaccinations, the less infection there will be, and therefore less antimicrobial resistance. If governments and humans collaborate across borders, knowledge and wisdom will prevail.

For me, one of the most amazing things I've seen since the invasion of Ukraine is the humanitarianism enacted by young people and dedicated medics - they raise their own finances to get to wherever they are needed, pack old ambulances with supplies and donations, to help rebuild and provide medical care. I cannot see the events in Ukraine as anything other than barbaric, but maybe the world will come together even more in the wake of them.

I really recommend reading this book to gain a better understanding of the threats facing humanity currently - it is eye opening.

PRAYER



In the coming months we will be celebrating several major Christian festivals such as Easter, Ascension and Pentecost. a Question of Gardening

Potato Growing Guide!

There's an old gardening tradition to plant seed potatoes on Good Friday. It's thought this story comes from the time of a six-day working week, when Good Friday would have been the first day off since Christmas.

If you're a seasoned potato grower, or are trying them for the first time this spring, you won't regret it. They are easy to grow and can even be planted in bags or large containers if you don't have lots of space.

There are three main types of potatoes to grow, named according to when they're harvested:

First earlies: The first to crop, taking around 10-12 weeks. These are usually salad varieties, such as Rocket.

Second earlies: These take a few weeks longer at 14-16 weeks. Examples include Charlotte and Maris Peer.

Main crop: The longest to grow at 16-22 weeks. Main crop potatoes are often grown to store over winter. Pink Fir Apple and Maris Piper are recommended varieties.

Seed potatoes can be bought online or from your local garden centre. The pack information will tell you how to cook your potatoes and if they're best enjoyed in a salad, for mashing or roasting. There's nothing like a home-grown potato.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

NEWS FROM WORTH PARISH COUNCIL

A Community Governance Review is being undertaken to consider whether a new Parish and Parish Council should be created for Crawley Down. This is in response to a petition from local electors.

All electors of Crawley Down and Copthorne received a Public Notice from Mid Sussex District Council in February. This invites them to contribute their views on this important matter which will determine the future local governance arrangements for the parish area, effective from May 2023.

What is the stance of Worth Parish Council?

Worth Parish Council as a representative body is neither in favour nor against a split. Currently 4 of the 17 Worth Parish councillors fully support the petition. There are concerns related to the lack of transparency and the way the petition came about - being submitted to Mid Sussex District Council without any discussion or case presentation to Worth Parish Council. We have seen little evidence that the proposed change will deliver the claimed benefits and do not have the information required to determine whether the considerable cost, risks and impacts of a split are justified. Nobody should underestimate the complexity of splitting an existing parish council.

EXTENSION TO 7.5 TONNE WEIGHT LIMIT FEEDBACK

You may remember from a previous newsletter that Worth Parish Council submitted an application to West Sussex County Council for a Community Highways Scheme to extend the 7.5 tonne weight limit to cover Brookhill Road, Copthorne Bank (into Surrey) and Borers Arms Road.

Unfortunately, the application was unsuccessful. Feedback from West Sussex County Council stated 'your application did not meet the set criteria appropriate to deliver a sustainable and beneficial highways improvement, that also aligns with the County Council priorities'.

There is no right to appeal on this application.

DO YOU KNOW THE LAW ON E SCOOTERS?

Buying an e-scooter can be tempting especially as they can be purchased from popular retailers.

However, the current law is clear. It is illegal to use a privately owned e-scooter on pavements, cycle paths or public roads at present. The only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land with landowner permission.

Why is this?

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs), so they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements, such as: MOT, licensing, insurance and drink/drug driving legislation. As e-scooters do not have number plates, signalling ability and don't always have visible rear lights, they can't be used legally on the roads.

BY JOINING THE LANTERN LIGHT PARADE AT 9.30pm

We invite children and adults to join in the procession by making a lantern of your own to carry.....if you can't come on the day, or 9.30pm is a bit late for you, don't worry – we can display your lantern even if you can't be there – **just bring it to the Green** in the afternoon and leave it at the Information Point by the stage. It is really important that all lanterns are safe....NO BREAKABLE MATERIALS to be used (ie china, glass etc) and NO NAKED FLAMES. Lanterns could be lit with battery lights, button lights or small torches.

HERE ARE SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR MAKING YOUR LANTERN:



QUICK AND EFFECTIVE:

- These simple lanterns made from paper or card may work well for little members of the parade.
- · Don't forget to add a carrying handle.
- They can be decorated brightly to celebrate the jubilee, fringing is good too.
- Cut the lines closer together and diagonally for a different effect.
- Slightly more involved but great paper/card/ tissue paper lanterns if you have a bit more time.

THE LAMPSHADE OPTION:

- Obtain a paper lampshade and decorate with coloured tissue paper, paint on a design or add a silhouette for a great effect.
- · Lights inside will bring them to life.



THE ADVANCED OPTION

- Stunning results can be achieved with willow lanterns for those with some time on their hands! The possibilities are endless.

East Surrey Family History Society


The East Surrey Family History Society can help you trace your family history, whether you have family connections in the East Surrey area or elsewhere.

As our name suggests, our records concern the eastern part of the ancient county of Surrey, which extends from the river Thames, south to the Sussex border and to the west, roughly a line including Richmond, Kingston, Leatherhead and Reigate.

If you are new to family history, then we can help put you on the path to good research. Not all records are available on the internet and some of those are very confusing. If you are more experienced, then we can reinforce your knowledge with additional information or techniques.

Locally, a monthly talk is held in Lingfield, with a speaker, and we are also continuing to hold a Zoom talk every month. We have a Research Centre, also in Lingfield, with a team to help solve any family tree problems.


