



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## **Editorial**

This week, as we're putting the magazine together, happens to be Mental Health Week. The Mental Health Foundation, a UK charity established in 1949, started MHW in 2001 with the aim of raising awareness of mental health, and it's now actually one of the biggest initiatives focusing on this issue in the UK.

Each year there is a theme, and this year it is loneliness.

This seems fitting as, of course, the pandemic has had a lasting impact on mental health. If we didn't know before how much loneliness affects wellbeing, 2 years of social distancing and isolation has shown us it certainly does, and the theme was chosen to highlight that. Studies have shown that young people especially have suffered as a result of lockdown, something that I think about a lot as I have 2 teenagers.

Loneliness has a big impact on our minds and bodies. Lonely people suffer from lack of sleep and stress, for example, raising cortisol levels in the body which, as well as increasing the risk of developing anxiety or depression, can have long term impacts such as suicidal thoughts, heart disease and lower life expectancy. Feeling socially connected, on the other hand, is thought to reduce your cortisol levels.

In this way, loneliness impacts both individuals and society, by putting pressure on public health services. We need to feel connected to each other and our communities to maintain our mental health.

The Mental Health Foundation states that - 'Prevention is at the heart of what we do, we aim to find and address the sources of mental health problems so that people and communities can thrive'.

It's been 74 years since the Mental Health Foundation was set up, and 20 years since the start of Mental Health Week, and while it's great that people are now more willing to talk about their own mental health and wellbeing, in the hope that it will help themselves and others and there's less judgement around anxiety and depression, it seems, we MUST NOT forget those suffering with more severe forms of mental illness, shut away in mental health units, or those who've been made homeless by the cost of living crisis and isolated from their community. We must find a way to realise the work started by so many and permanently include them in society.

This is why the MHF are encouraging people to share their stories of loneliness to try to combat this (#Ivebeenthere). They believe this is the best way to help and are greatly supported by role models such as famous athletes, who share their stories to show people they are not alone.

So, if there's a positive lesson that's come out of the pandemic, it's that now you know what it's like to be lonely, don't let others suffer if you think you can make even a tiny difference.

I've been really happy to see one of my own children try to help others following the pandemic by supporting an amazing local charity called Climb Free, which aims to help those suffering with their mental health climb back to fitness. Based at the Volume 1 climbing wall in Felbridge, the guys involved in the charity believe so much in the positive power of climbing on mental health, they've been sharing their own mental health stories on instagram and have spent the 7 days of Mental Health Week climbing the height of Everest 7 times. They are exhausted and battered but are not giving up, determined to build a supportive and welcoming community for those who need it.

In our own lovely Copthorne, we have Friday Friends (page 14) and Coffee, Cake and Conversation (page 15), and in the WPC newsletter there are some links to some West Sussex advice for combating loneliness. Nationally, there are lots of organisations who can help. If you are lonely, or you think someone else is, you don't have to be alone.

#### THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE



Earlier this year, on 6 February 2022, the 70th anniversary of her accession, Her Majesty the Queen became the first British monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee. The Queen, 96, acceded the throne after the death of her father, King George VI, on 6 February 1952.

The Archbishop of Canterbury marked the Queen's 70 years on the throne as a 'symbol of stability and hope'.

The Queen herself spoke of her hope that this Jubilee would 'bring together families and friends, neighbours and communities after some difficult times for so many of us'.

She said, 'As I look ahead with a sense of hope and optimism, I am reminded of how much we can be thankful for'.

The UK and Commonwealth will celebrate the Jubilee with a 4 day Bank Holiday from 2-5 June 2022. It will include church services, the Trooping of the Colour, concerts, the lighting of beacons, and many other events.

Our village green is in an ideal place to bring our community together as we join in with these national celebrations. On Friday 3rd June from morning till evening there will a wide range of events and activities including a dog show, games, tea parties, competitions, exhibitions, a Jubilee prom and a lantern procession. At St John's Church in the morning there will also be a live-stream projection on the big screen of the Thanksgiving Service at St Paul's Cathedral. On Sunday 5th June there will be a 10.30am Jubilee Celebration church service in the church yard followed by Jazz on the Green at 1pm. My prayer in all this, alongside many others that pray, is that God would continue to strengthen and guide our Queen and bless her with continued health and wisdom. As we celebrate her anniversary, we continue to give thanks for her dedication to us all, and her faithful witness to Jesus Christ.







# a Question of Gardening

#### Summer is here!

Our allotment site is a hive of activity at this time of year, with seed sowing, plants growing rapidly and the beginnings of the busy harvesting season.

Seeds are sown continuously to ensure a succession of crops over the growing season and seeds can be sown directly into the soil now it is warm enough.

Our plants are starting to grow noticeably from day to day, some squashes and pumpkin foliage can grow up to 30cm in one day. The sunflowers start to reach for the sky and the tomato plants shoot up quickly.

The first strawberries are ready for picking, the first strawberry eaten straight off the plant always tastes amazing. Redcurrants and raspberries follow on quickly.

The flowers are blooming with gorgeously scented sweet peas and sweet williams, bright calendulas and cornflowers, all providing pollen for the insects, bees, butterflies and moths that help to pollinate our plants.

Soil functions best when it is full of plant roots, which is why bare soil grows unwanted weeds. Try covering your soil with a blanket of plants, vegetables, fruit or flowers which will fill the spaces and stop the light from reaching the weeds seeds. A thick mulch of compost or chippings on top of your soil will also help reduce weeds from growing as well as retaining moisture in the soil.

Enjoy your summer garden, whether you are growing food, flowers or just relaxing in the natural world around you.

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Happy to say that we are now experiencing much better weather than the last time I wrote this article! Fingers crossed we are in for a nice, long summer.

Firstly, following our recent full council meeting I would like to welcome Cllr Liz Williams into our team. Liz comes on board as a Crawley Down Councillor to replace Elaine Anscomb, who recently stood down from the council. That is some big shoes to fill, but I'm sure Liz is more than capable from early signs.

The first consultation period for the Community Governance Review (CGR) has now passed. I hope that you – as we did – sent your views to Mid Sussex District Council so that they will be considered as part of their draft recommendations? We will find out what these are around June time.

With the CGR now out of our hands for the time being, we can concentrate on moving forward with some other council business and progress some items that had taken a bit of a back seat.

Hopefully by the time you read this, all the streetlights in Copthorne and Crawley Down that are owned by Worth Parish Council will have a QR code on them that will allow faulty lights to be reported via the Worth Parish Council website. We will give more details on this when it is up and running.

We are also hoping to make significant steps towards getting a youth support worker to cover both villages. Depending upon the outcome of a couple of imminent meetings, our aim is to have this provision in place before the school summer holidays. This will be a significant milestone and one the council are very keen to see achieved.

We are also keen to progress with a series of traffic surveys in Copthorne to assess the issues on our roads. We will then explore resolving any identified (or confirmed) issues from there. We also continue to explore funding avenues for the additional sports and playground facilities we want to implement and will keep you all informed of where we are with all these matters.

May sees the end of my first year as chairman of Worth Parish Council. It has been a difficult year with the Community Governance Review presenting an unprecedented challenge that has absorbed a lot of our resource and attention. I have no idea what will happen at the council's annual meeting in May, but I will offer to stand as chairman for a further year and would welcome the opportunity to continue with some of the great work my fellow members and our amazing staff at the council have been doing so far. It has been a pleasure serving you for the last year, but I do have unfinished business!

I will finish by wishing you all well going into summer and hope that you will give your support to the two big Platinum Jubilee events coming up in both villages. I have absolutely no doubt that both will be incredible events reflecting the community spirit within both our fabulous villages.



Do you have any programmes of past events held in Copthorne?





## **SCOUT AND GUIDE JUMBLE SALE Q & A**

# Here are a some of the questions regularly asked about the jumble sales



#### Q: When are the jumble sales?

A: Usually three times a year in March, June and October. This year due to the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations there is no sale in June - it was held in May instead. The next sale is 8th October.

#### Q: When do you collect jumble and what do you accept?

A: We collect on the Friday evening before the jumble sale from the kerbside unless you ask us to call. It is probably easier to say what we do not accept. We do not accept fridges, freezers, cookers, TVs, computers, printers, other household electrical appliances, upholstered furniture, settees, beds mattresses, duvets or pillows.

#### Q: Why are you no longer taking electrical goods?

A: Even though we are a charity we have to pay to dispose of any electrical waste that is left at the end of the sale, and it has to be taken separately to the recycling centre.

#### Q: Why didn't you pick up my jumble that I left out?

A: We are sorry if we sometimes miss some jumble – it is not always easy to see black sacks in bad weather and if it is not on the kerbside we may not have spotted it. We do our best.

#### Q: What roads do you collect from?

A: We collect from the main body of the village and Newlands Park. If you don't receive a leaflet then you are not on our collection round, you can always deliver your jumble to the Scout and Guide centres on the Friday evening or Saturday morning before 10:00.

# Q: What happens to any thing left over, do you pass it on to other charities?

A: We recycle as much as possible: Metal, clothes, shoes, bags, wood, cardboard, china and books. We are left with an enormous amount of waste that cannot be recycled and unfortunately goes to landfill. After the March jumble sale this year sale we took three loads totalling 2.7 Tonnes to the Crawley recycling centre of which 440 kg was duvets, pillows, soiled/torn clothes.

# Q: How long does it take to plan and organise the jumble sales?

A: We start planning 6 weeks before each sale and the volunteers give up over 250 man hours for each sale.

#### Q: Do you need help with jumble sales?

A: The answer is always yes. We need help before the event delivering leaflets to the village, on the Friday evenings help unloading the vans and sorting, Saturday morning sorting clothes and bric-à-brac and Saturday afternoon, sorting, packing up and loading vans.



# St Modwen Q&A

A couple of editions of the magazine ago, St Modwen invited any questions locals may have about the new development at Heathy Wood. Here are the answers.

The Heathy Wood project is making strong progress with some 100 residential units in occupation and two housebuilders now on site: St. Modwen Homes on Phases 1 & 2, and Taylor Wimpey on Phases 3 & 4. St. Modwen Industrial & Logistics has completed both the first two units to the west of the site next to the motorway and is currently going through the planning process for a third unit on Copthorne Way. The emphasis is now moving strongly towards amenities, management, access and linkages and, of course, community within the project. A new website has been launched to reflect this movement: www.heathywood. co.uk. At this stage St. Modwen also especially thank the Local Liaison Group members for their input, guidance and enthusiasm, who have been the voice of local people on the development since the outset. So we welcome the questions raised by the Copthorne residents through the village magazine and have responded below.

# Magazine **Q.** Coming into the Heathy Wood development it really

**Questions from Copthorne Village** 

looks neat and tidy and well looked after. It has also, of course, got a business side to the development. What is however very noticeable when walking around, particularly where the industrial businesses are, is a fair amount of litter and discarded coffee cups and water bottles. What is being done to ensure that there is responsibility taken by St. Modwen and its business partners to reduce the impact on the surrounding environment and the public that walk through on a regular basis?

A. St. Modwen has appointed Preim Estate Management Company to ensure the site is consistently maintained and cleaned, and who will ensure that issues such as this are properly managed.

Q. When will St Modwen start planting the additional trees needed to screen the warehouse which is planned to be built on the green area currently very visible from Copthorne Way? The sooner the planting starts the sooner the trees will begin to provide that screening and, in accord with the country's aim to plant trees for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, very appropriate to plant them this year.

A. The L1 plot on Copthorne Way referred to is still currently going through the planning approval process. Any landscaping and tree planting can only happen after consent and is reliant on having first completed the earthworks and infrastructure activities. It is therefore not feasible that any tree planting would be practical until spring next year.

**Q.** Has West Sussex County Council made a decision on the new school site yet? If not, when is that expected?

**A.** St. Modwen is continuing to work with the County Council to provide information. The timing and decision rests with West Sussex CC.

**Q.** When will the new doctors' surgery be built?

**A.** There is good progress on the surgery. Work is continuing with the PCC to enable a planning application to be brought forward at which point we will have a clearer picture on timing.

Q. When will the allotments site be built?

**A.** The allotments site is planned to come forward with the public park in 2023 when the access road through phase 4 at the north end of the site is complete.


# Copthorne Youth Football Club Update
