Poppies

Three days before Armistice Sunday and poppies had already been placed on individual war graves. Before you left, I pinned one onto your lapel, crimped petals, spasms of paper red, disrupting a blockade of yellow bias binding around your blazer.

Sellotape bandaged around my hand, I rounded up as many white cat hairs as I could, smoothed down your shirt's upturned collar, steeled the softening of my face. I wanted to graze my nose across the tip of your nose, play at being Eskimos like we did when you were little.

I resisted the impulse to run my fingers through the gelled blackthorns of your hair. All my words flattened, rolled, turned into felt, slowly melting. I was brave, as I walked with you, to the front door, threw it open, the world overflowing like a treasure chest. A split second and you were away, intoxicated.

After you'd gone I went into your bedroom, released a song bird from its cage. Later a single dove flew from the pear tree, and this is where it has led me, skirting the church yard walls, my stomach busy making tucks, darts, pleats, hat-less, without a winter coat or reinforcements of scarf, gloves.

On reaching the top of the hill I traced the inscriptions on the war memorial, leaned against it like a wishbone. The dove pulled freely against the sky, an ornamental stitch. I listened, hoping to hear your playground voice catching on the wind.

Alex Writes June 2025

As I sit down to write this, we are in my favourite time of the year with the blossom on the trees, spring flowering shrubs breaking out into colour everywhere and the birds singing and nesting in the hedges.

Yet I am acutely aware that we have also been looking at the bleak face of modern life - war - both in the commemoration of the 80th anniversary of VE day and conflict it seems in every continent. Sadly the 'war to end all wars' was anything but, followed as it was by the Second World War and further wars since. I wonder what those people celebrating the end of the war in Europe in 1945 were thinking of as they partied in the streets? I am guessing there was huge relief that the immediate danger on UK soil was over, that loved ones would be coming home, although of course the war did not finally end until later in the year after the Japanese surrender in August 1945. There must have been a strong sense of optimism, that finally normality would return.



As the months and years passed on, only then did the full horror of what had taken place in the various concentration camps run by the Nazis and the Japanese become apparent. Reparations were demanded, justice was sought at Nuremberg and elsewhere. But nothing it seems has dissuaded others from committing atrocities and stirring up conflict. How amazing it would be to switch on the news and hear nothing of 'Man's inhumanity to Man', even for one day.

One positive news item has been the celebration of the life and work of David Attenborough on his 99th Birthday. A man who resolutely remains optimistic about the life on this planet, whilst warning of the dangers, and who has chronicled the extraordinary beauty and complexity of this world.

The Japanese have a custom at this time of the year called *Hanami* which is all about sitting under a cherry blossom tree and appreciating its transient beauty,

often with food and drink in the company of family and friends. It is also a peaceful experience, an opportunity to reflect and relax.

In the Bible the image reflects the climate of the Holy Land, where sitting under a fig tree is used to symbolise a place of complete rest and well-being. In a book called *Micah*, there is a prophecy that we often read at Remembrance services which says that God will establish justice in the world one day and fighting implements will be re-fashioned for peaceful uses for example into tools for growing food. Then we are told:

'Each man will sit under his own shade tree, each woman in safety will tend her own garden . . '

(Micah 4, Message version)

Peace is a precious gift in these times - please do come and sit for a while in our church or churchyard - under a tree even! In this busy, challenging world it's good to take time to reflect, be still and ask God to give you his peace.

A Recipe from our Lent Booklet

Our Lent Course this year focused on the film Chocolat. This is one of the recipes from the Lent booklet:

Pineapple and Chocolate Cheesecake

(12 smallish portions)

Ingredients:

85g butter or margarine

1 packed (400g) plain chocolate digestive biscuits

1 tin crushed pineapple

1 packet lemon jelly

56g caster sugar

1 (500g) carton fromage frais

For decoration:

1 small tin pineapple rings Dark glacé cherries 56g approx. dark chocolate

Recipe:

Put the butter in a large bowl and heat gently in the microwave until melted.

Put the chocolate biscuits onto a tray and crush with a rolling pin. Add the crushed biscuits to the melted butter and stir until thoroughly mixed.

Press the biscuit mixture into the base and sides of a 30cm flan dish. Put the crushed pineapple into

Put the crushed pineapple into a sieve over a bowl to drain the excess liquid.

Put the whole jelly into a jug and melt in the microwave for one minute.

Add about 90ml of the juice from the crushed pineapple.

Put the fromage frais, the drained crushed pineapple and the jelly mixture into a large mixing bowl.

Stir thoroughly and add caster sugar to taste if needed.

Put the fromage frais mixture into the biscuit flan base, smooth until flat and store in the fridge until set.

When set, decorate with half rings of pineapple and cherries around the edge and grated chocolate in the centre.

SPEEDING WITHIN THE VILLAGE

The Copthorne Village Community Speedwatch are still in desperate need of volunteers and are appealing for more to come forward. Being a volunteer can involve as little as 1 hour every 2 or 3 weeks, although if you'd like to do more that would be welcomed. For more information, please go to communityspeedwatch. co.uk and click on Register/Join an Existing Group.

Alternatively, you can email Steve O'Connell of Sussex Police at stephen.oconnell@sussex.police.uk.

They now have 2,500 volunteers across Sussex, with 190 parish councils and 15 wardens carrying out community speedwatch initiatives. They issue 5,000 letters per month to drivers for speeding; from this they only have a repeat offender rate of less than 5% out of the 60,000 or so letters sent over the year, which means drivers really do take notice.

If you witness speeding in and around the village, you can report it via Operation Crackdown at *operationcrackdown.org*.

Copthorne and the original 'boffin' - what's the connection?

The small estate known as Newlands Park was built in the mid-1960s on the site of the demolished property 'Newlands', pictured here. It's actually the family who lived at Newlands who start the story.

Dr Robert Brown, FRCS, and his wife Sarah, were the first members of the family to live at Newlands, with their four children. Robert, the eldest, was born in 1850.

Robert joined the Royal Engineers, married Marian in Dinapore Bengal, and they had three children, Dora, Austin and Basil. Robert had served in the Afghan War 1879-80. From 1884 he was in Egypt, as Inspector of Irrigation, during the construction of the Nile Reservoir. He was appointed Inspector General of Upper Egypt, then in 1894 of Lower Egypt, and wrote several books on irrigation, amongst others. Robert and Marian returned to Newlands in 1903 on retirement, by then he was Major Sir Robert Hanbury Brown, RE, KCMG. The couple were very involved in Copthorne and Crawley Down village life, Scouts, Church, Parish Council, etc.

Anyone who has attended the Remembrance Day service at St John's will have heard read aloud, before the two minutes' silence, the names of those Copthorne men who gave their lives in the 'Great War' and World War II. One of those names is Major Austin Hanbury Brown, DSO, MC, who died at the Somme in 1918 - Robert and Marian's son.

It is the third child of the family, Col. Basil Hanbury Brown, who leads us to the 'boffin' connection.

Basil's son Robert, born in India in 1916, was educated in the UK,

and with a degree in engineering, he joined Imperial College. Here he met Sir Robert Watson-Watt, who named Robert as the prototype for his definition 'boffin': 'A researcher of high scientific competence'.

In 1936 Robert was recruited to join Watson-Watt and his team working on ground radar at Orfordness and then Bowen's Airborne Radar Group at Bawdsey. Later he was to play a leading role in the development of night-fighting, radar techniques for dropping parachute troops and, working in the USA on methods of identifying 'friends from foe'.

After the war he joined Bernard Lovell at Jodrell Bank in the early days of Radio Astronomy. Together with R Q Twiss he challenged conventional theory (the Hanbury Brown-Twiss Effect) and under a storm of controversy launched the new science of Quantum Optics.

Moving to Australia in 1962
Robert established the Narrabri
Observatory, where he built
the first Stellar Intensity
Interferometer, which made a
major impact on our knowledge
of the stars. He described his
life and career in his interesting
autobiography 'Boffin, A Personal
Story of the Early Days of Radar,
Radio Astronomy and Quantum
Optics'. He accumulated many
honours during his brilliant career.

and greatgrandson of Dr Robert Brown of Newlands, Copthorne. He died in 2002 age 85, and is buried in St John's churchyard, Copthorne.

to mention just a few have already rendered invaluable service.

There have been a few times that the committee had almost dwindled to four, but fortunately on those occasions we have managed to twist a few arms and recruit new members.

However, back to the new Millennium. This year our carnival was held on Saturday, July 1. Usually it is scheduled for the last weekend in June, but when we learned that some of our Guides and Cubs were away on camp we chose the new date, as it saved the children the dilemma of having to choose between camp or carnival.

As usual the carnival procession round the village started at Knowle Drive, headed by a pipe band marching along Copthorne Bank, Brookhill Road, Church Lane and ending up at the Village Green where the carnival was beginning. It was evident looking at the floats that many hours of work and hopefully fun had gone into their decoration, the children absolutely love to dress up and proudly display themselves in the procession, likewise of course the adults on their floats have a chance to wear their costumes and show that they haven't quite grown up yet and can have a good time too. This year, the gospel singers entertained us throughout the afternoon, with a pipe band dis-

For the smaller children the self-drive electric cars were a popular draw, with a queue for most of the afternoon. Likewise the miniature ride on real steam railway run by the East Grinstead Model Engineers was kept busy all afternoon. Nearby was the bouncy castle catered for most ages of children.

In addition to the entertainment there was a large number of stalls, mainly run by the local village organisations to help fund their expenses through out the year. These included ice cream, burgers, hot dogs, candy floss, rolling horse and children's games to mention just a few.

Our raffle this year was in support of the Crawley and Horsham Cystic Fibrosis Support Group and we are very pleased to announce that we were able to donate £1,069. Thanks to all of you who bought tickets and helped sell them.

Many organisations have benefited from the carnival raffle over the years, including St Catherine's Hospice, Guide Dogs for the Blind, Copthorne Junior School Swimming Pool and the Crawley Scanner Appeal.

In the early years the raffle used to raise around £60, but in more recent years we have seen figures range from £400 to in excess of £1,000. One year we were able to add to the raffle from our profit to give a record £1,400. In the first year it cost in the region of £160 to run the carnival, today the costs are in the region of £2,000 plus. Times have changed.

The proposed date of next year's carnival will be Saturday, June 30 at 2pm and the theme will be Fairy Tales, with floats leaving from Knowle Drive


